I. Introduction

Childhood lead poisoning is a serious problem throughout the United States. In 1991, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) changed their definition of elevated blood lead levels from 25 micrograms per deciliter of whole blood to 10 micrograms per deciliter. Because the definition changed, many more children were considered to have elevated blood lead levels. In addition, the National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey, NHANES, (1988-1991) found approximately three percent of the nation's children had lead levels of 10 micrograms/deciliter or higher. In the state of Colorado, surveillance data from January 1, 1994 to June 1, 1995 shows 1.9% of children tested had levels \geq 10 micrograms/deciliter. But, a 1995 survey done by the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment illustrated areas within Colorado may have higher rates of childhood blood lead levels where the majority of the housing was built before 1950.

There are numerous exposure sources of lead in the environment, but children are at greatest risk for poisoning in their own homes. Some common exposure sources in the home include, but are not limited to, lead based paint, plumbing with lead pipes, contaminated soil and dust, and lead hazards that are caused by home remodeling, hobbies, or improvement projects.

In 1978 the Consumer Product Safety Commission banned the production of paint that included more than 0.06% lead by weight. Although this was a major breakthrough in lowering lead levels in children, approximately three quarters of the nation's housing still have some lead based paint hazard. These hazards not only include chipping paint itself, but dust and soil that has been contaminated by lead based paint particles.

The Lead Services Directory has been compiled as a resource for people concerned about lead poisoning. It includes listings of private and public agencies offering lead poisoning prevention services. Some of the agencies analyze blood lead samples. Others perform consultation services, environmental sampling or abatement work. State and Local Health Departments are listed to help with other questions and concerns.

Where clearance levels differ, we recommend that the most stringent clearance levels be used.

III. Laboratories Providing Blood Lead Analysis

All clinical laboratories must satisfy the requirements of the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Act by participating in nationally recognized proficiency testing programs such as those sponsored by the College of American Pathologists (CAP), the Centers for Disease Control, and the New York State Department of Health. A laboratory may also be certified by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) if the laboratory participates in a nationally recognized proficiency testing program and has had satisfactory blood lead testing in the prior 12 month period. VI. Laboratories Providing Lead Analysis in Soil, Paint Chips, and Dust wipe Samples

Several certification programs exist for environmental lead testing of soil or paint samples. The Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Contract Laboratory Program (CLP) evaluates laboratories which test samples that were collected in the environment. These samples are usually collected at hazardous waste sites or Superfund cleanup sites. The American Industrial Hygiene Association (AIHA) certifies laboratories for paint chip, soil, and/or dust wipe samples. If a company participates in the AIHA's Environmental Lead Proficiency Analytical Testing Program (ELPAT), it may apply for accreditation to the new National Lead Laboratory Accreditation Program (NLLAP) which is designed to meet legislative requirements developed by EPA.

Depending on the work, the company may have to be certified by other groups.

1. What training do you have in lead investigation and/or abatement? Where did you get this training? What did this training cover? May I have a copy of your certificate(s)?
2. What kind of experience do you have in the field? (Get a listing of prior projects.)
3. Can I get a list of references? (This should include past clients for whom they have worked, with the clients' phone numbers.)
4. How many people do you employ? May I see some evidence of their training and experience in the field of lead-based paint?
5. What kind of equipment do you have? What kind of personal protective equipment do you use? What precautions will you take to insure that the occupants and the building are protected from contamination?
6. What methods will you use to do this job? Are these in compliance with the Colorado Air Quality Control Commission Regulation No. 19?
7. Are you certified by the state of Colorado to perform lead-based paint abatement?
