

Radiation Management Projects that Impact Radiological Qualities of the Environment

Major projects that impact, or may impact, the radiological quality of the human environment require a specific license be issued.

Who Must Apply

Licenses are needed for the following activities:

1. Source material millings.
2. Commercial waste storage, treatment or disposal or by incineration.
3. Transfer or disposal of waste from treatment or incineration.
4. Commercial waste disposal by land burial or by underground injection.
5. Any other project within the authority of the Department that will significantly affect the radiological quality of the human environment.

Duration of Permit

Renewal every five years.

Fees

Fees cover the full cost of reviewing, approving, amending and inspecting the licensed facility and are assessed at the hourly rate of \$85/hour. After issuance of the license, an annual fee is charged to the licensee each year until termination of the license.

Application Process

Application - file nine months prior to anticipated construction of project. May require a state environmental impact assessment. If a federal agency requires an Environmental Impact Statement, the Department will use this information in its decision-making process.

Hearing Notice - 90 days prior to hearing

Appeals - within 30 days of the initial decision

Public Participation

There are no public participation requirements for radioactive material licenses except those for uranium mills.
